### Sunday, May 2, Fifth Sunday of Easter

Acts 14:21-27/Rv 21:1-5a/Jn 13:31-33a, 34-35

## Sunday, May 9, Sixth Sunday of Easter

Acts 15:1-2, 22-29/Rv 21:10-14, 22-23/Jn 14:23-29

For mothers caring for children with special needs and for adult children caring for an ill or aging mother, we pray to the Lord.

#### Thursday, May 13, The Ascension of the Lord

Acts 1:1-11/Eph 1:17-23 or Heb 9:24-28; 10:19-23/Lk 24:46-53

That caregivers, as they move through the times and seasons of their helping a loved one, will know that their heavenly Father is with them every step of the way, we pray to the Lord.

## Sunday, May 16, Seventh Sunday of Easter

Acts 7:55-60/Rv 22:12-14, 16-17, 20/Jn 17:20-26

That family caregivers, sometimes frightened or discouraged, will know that "before the foundation of the world" they have been loved by the same God who now asks them to help his beloved son or daughter, we pray to the Lord.

### Sunday, May 23, Pentecost Sunday

Vigil: Gn 11:1-9 or Ex 19:3-8a, 16-20b or Ez 37:1-14 or Jl 3:1-5/Rom 8:22-27/

Jn 7:37-39; Day: Acts 2:1-11/1 Cor 12:3b-7, 12-13 or Rom 8:8-17/Jn 20:19-23 or 14:15-16, 23b-26 That family caregivers, in their many "different forms of service," find courage and comfort through the gifts of the Holy Spirit,

we pray to the Lord.

### Sunday, May 30, The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Prv 8:22-31/Rom 5:1-5/Jn 16:12-15

That all caregivers and care-receivers may take delight in each others, just as God – the Father, Son and Holy Spirit -- takes delight in each of us, we pray to the Lord.
