Sunday, February 21 First Sunday of Lent

Dt 26:4-10/Rom 10:8-13/Lk 4:1-13

we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, February 28, Second Sunday of Lent

Gn 15:5-12, 17-18/Phil 3:17—4:1 or 3:20—4:1/Lk 9:28b-36
